OSCAR NOMINATIONS 2024: THE COMPLETE LIST

"Oppenheimer" led the 2024 Academy Award nominations on Tuesday with 13 nods for director Christopher Nolan's film about the making of the nuclear bomb. It was followed by the fantastical drama "Poor Things" with 11 nominations, and the epic story of Native American murders, "Killers of the Flower Moon" with 10. But "Killers of the Flower Moon," directed by Martin Scorsese, suffered two major snubs: lead actor Leonardo DiCaprio and the screenplay by Scorsese and co-writer Eric Roth.

Among the other notable snubs on Tuesday morning were "Barbie" director Greta Gerwig and star Margot Robbie (though Robbie was nominated as a lead producer for Best Picture, while Gerwig showed up in the adapted screenplay category), Willem Dafoe ("Poor Things"), and all actors from "May December," notably Natalie Portman, Julianne Moore and Charles Melton.

Lack of recognition for "American Symphony" in the documentary feature category was also unexpected. Matthew Heineman's well reviewed film about Jon Batiste preparing a musical opus while his wife, writer Suleika Jaouad, was in the hospital for cancer treatment was considered a shoo-in by many people, as was "Still: A Michael J. Fox Movie," also shut out.

But perhaps more surprising were how many acclaimed or buzzy 2023 films received zero nominations. They include "All of Us Strangers," "Asteroid City," "Saltburn," "The Taste of Things," "Passages," and "Showing Up."

A few notable <u>footnotes</u> occurred, including <u>Justin Triet</u> <u>becoming the eighth woman</u> ever to break into the directing category, John Williams is again the oldest nominee in history at age 91 for scoring the newest "Indiana Jones" film, while Martin Scorsese is the <u>oldest-ever directing nominee</u> at 81 for "Killers of the Flower Moon."

And on the topic of "Killers," <u>Lily Gladstone became the first-ever acting nominee for a Native American</u> in Oscar history, while late composer and Scorsese friend Robbie Robertson earned his first Academy Award nomination <u>posthumously</u>. The musician passed away last August at age 80.

The 95th Oscars will take place on March 10, 2024 at the Dolby Theater and will be hosted by Jimmy Kimmel. The event will be telecast live on ABC.

Oppenheimer was named best picture at the 2024 Oscars, which were were handed out Sunday.

The film took a total of seven awards during the night: Christopher Nolan won best director, Cillian Murphy won best actor and Robert Downey Jr. won best supporting actor. The film also won awards for best cinematography, best original score and best film editing.

In a surprise, Emma Stone won best actress for Poor Things, which also snapped up three crafts wins, for best costume design, production design, and makeup and hairstyling. She beat out perceived frontrunner Lily Gladstone, who has scooped up numerous awards for her role in Killers of the Flower Moon.

The winners of the 96th annual Academy Awards were unveiled at the Dolby Theatre at Ovation Hollywood. The show was televised live on ABC, with an earlier-thanusual start time this year, and in more than 200 territories worldwide. Jimmy Kimmel returned for his

fourth stint as host. (See the red carpet arrivals.)

Tuning into the Golden Globes this year meant more than catching a glimpse of the stars or getting an idea of what the Oscars might have in store.

After the ethics, finance and diversity scandal within the Hollywood Foreign Press Association <u>led to the cancellation of the 2022 broadcast</u>, the Golden Globes <u>were sold in 2023 and the Hollywood Foreign Press dissolved</u>. So the looming question seemed to be: What impact would the show have this year under new ownership?

In the end, some things went exactly as expected, others not so much.



2024 Golden Globe Awards: Big Winners of the Night Include 'Oppenheimer,' 'Succession,' 'Beef' and 'The Bear'

"Oppenheimer" emerged as the movie to beat in the coming
Oscar race, winning five Golden Globes, and HBO's "Succession"
was the top television winner, as expected, with four trophies.

Jan. 7, 2024

"Succession," which was up for the most awards on the television side, tied a record (with "Mad Men" and "The X-Files") for the most wins in the best drama category — the series won for its second and third season in 2020 and 2022. And three of the show's actors, Kieran Culkin, Sarah Snook and Matthew Macfadyen, took home awards.

"The Bear" and "Only Murders in the Building" were each nominated for five awards — "The Bear" received three and "Only Murders" was left empty-handed.

On the movies side, "Oppenheimer," which received eight nominations, ended up with five awards, including for the top prize in drama. Additionally, Cillian Murphy won best actor in a drama, while Christopher Nolan won best director.

"Barbie," which had the most movie nominations, only ended up with two awards — but it did beat out "Taylor Swift: The Eras Tour" in the new cinematic and box office achievement category.







Astra Film Awards: 'Barbie' Wins Eight Awards, Including Best Picture

Barbie led all films with eight wins at the Astra Film Awards on Saturday night, but the biggest winner of all may have been the HCA — an organization of "critics, entertainment journalists, content creators, industry insiders and creatives" formerly known as the Hollywood Critics Association and recently rebranded as the Hollywood Creative Alliance — which appears to have weathered external criticisms and internal dissension, given the sizable talent turnout at its flagship event.

Among those who came to the Biltmore in downtown L.A. to collect honors during a weekend packed with awards season activities leading up to the Golden Globe Awards: Barbie's Greta Gerwig, who collected the best picture and best original screenplay prizes, the former with producer David Heyman, who, in turn, collected Margot Robbie's best actress prize; Mark Ronson, who accepted best original song ("I'm Just Ken") and, on behalf of Ryan Gosling, best supporting actor; The Color Purple's Fantasia Barrino, Danielle Brooks and Colman Domingo, who accepted the best cast ensemble award; Are You There God?
